Categorical Waivers Available: Fire/smoke dampers inspected every 6 years - HOSPITALS ONLY

After due consideration of State survey agency findings and conclusions of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), we are issuing a categorical waiver pursuant to 42 CFR 482.41(b)(2) to permit a testing interval of 6 years rather than 4 years for the maintenance testing of fire and smoke dampers in hospital heating and ventilating systems, so long as the hospital's testing system conforms to the requirements under 2007 edition of NFPA 80: Standard for Fire Doors and Other Opening Protectives and the 2007 edition of NFPA 105: Standard for the Installation of Smoke Door Assemblies. The 6-year testing interval shall commence on the date of the last documented damper test.

2007 NFPA 80

- 19.4* Periodic Inspection and Testing.
- 19.4.1 Each damper shall be tested and inspected 1 year after installation.
- 19.4.1.1 The test and inspection frequency shall then be every 4 years, except in hospitals, where the frequency shall be every 6 years.

2007 NFPA 105:

- 6.5 Periodic Inspection and Testing.
- 6.5.1 Smoke dampers for dedicated and non-dedicated smoke control systems shall be inspected and tested in accordance with NFPA 92A, Standard for Smoke-Control Systems Utilizing Barriers and Pressure Differences.
- 6.5.2 Each damper shall be tested and inspected one year after installation. The test and inspection frequency shall then be every 4 years, except in hospitals, where the frequency shall be every 6 years.
